The Congress to Campus: Webinar program allows former Members of Congress to interact with and educate students about our legislative branch of government.

The Program connects a bipartisan panel of up to 4 former Members of Congress with students for a 45-60 minute webinar. The discussion will provide an insider's look at Congress; what it takes to become a Member of Congress; and challenges and triumphs that the former Members were a part of. The bipartisan panel will show that Republicans and Democrats may have a difference of opinion but they can discuss topics civilly and respectfully.

Students will have the opportunity to submit their own questions to former Members to answer during the webinar.
