The Congress to Campus: Webinar program allows former Members of Congress to interact with and educate community college students about a series of legislative issues and topics.

With a format adapted to the structure of community colleges, the Program connects a bipartisan panel of up to 6 former Members of Congress with students through three 90-minute webinars over three months (one per month) from September until November. Divided between the three interactive broadcasts, the Members will discuss in detail the condition of the national economy and the job market, the many global challenges, and the November Mid-Term elections.

- Comprehensive discussion focused on the November Mid-Term elections that will have taken place
- Analysis of how the results of the elections will affect a range of issues and shape President Obama's final years in the White House.

## Interactive Experience

Students have the opportunity to ask specific questions about the topics before the seminar dates.

Students will have the opportunity to comment on the seminar discussions in real time via the host computer.

Students learn directly from their interaction with former lawmakers.
